



To vote your ballot, follow these simple steps

Mark your ballot

Use a blue or black ballpoint pen. Fill in the oval to the left of your choice.



If you lose your ballot or make a mistake, you may request a new ballot. You can:

Sign and date the envelope

Remove the top stub from your ballot by tearing at the perforated line. Place the ballot in the enclosed return envelope provided. Write the address where you live in Santa Cruz County on the envelope in the space provided.

Sign your name on the envelope. If you do not sign your envelope, we cannot count your ballot.

If you cannot sign your name, make a mark and have a witness sign on the line provided.

Do not let someone else sign your name for you. We will compare the signature on the envelope to the signatures we have on file for you to ensure it is your ballot. If your signature does not compare, we will contact you so you can correct your signature.

Write the **date** you signed the envelope. And provide a phone number or email where we can contact you if there is any problem.

If you enlist the help of someone you trust to return your ballot, have them print their name, sign their name, and write their relationship to you in the space provided on the ballot return envelope.

Return your voted ballot

1. Drop it off at one of the 24-hour drop boxes by 8pm on Election Day (Due to the fires in Santa Cruz County, some of these sites may have to be relocated due to fire damage. Check www.votescount.us for the latest information.) Aptos - Public Library, 7695 Soquel Dr. Santa Cruz - County Gov. Park Ave.: walk up Watsonville - County Health Center, 1430 Freedom Blvd. Capitola - City Hall, 420 Capitola Ave. Watsonville - Corralitos Community Center, 35 Browns Capitola - Shopping Mall (near Sears), 1855 41st Ave. Valley Rd. Felton - Covered Bridge Park, Mt. Hermon/Graham Hill

2. Return it in person before and including Election Day

You may drop off your ballot inside at one of the locations below or authorize someone you trust to return it.

3. Return it in person to a voting location

You can return your ballot to any voting location in Santa Cruz County. There will be 17 locations open Saturday Oct. 31 to Tuesday, Nov. 3. Due to the fires in Santa Cruz County, some of these sites may have to be relocated due to fire damage or being used for a shelter or other emergency purpose. Check <u>www.votescount.us</u> for the latest information.

Each location will be open for voting on the following dates and times:

- Saturday, October 31, 2020, 9am to 5pm
- Sunday, November 1, 2020, 9am to 5pm
- Monday, November 2, 2020, 8am to 5pm
- Tuesday, November 3, 2020, 7am to 8pm

4. Mail it so it is postmarked on or before Election Day, November 3

Ballot return envelopes are postage paid. Ballots postmarked on or before November 3 and received by November 20 will be considered received on time.
