It is financial mismanagement that leaves us facing new taxes every two years and constant appeals for "donations." (Taxes are mandatory, not charitable contributions.)

Parcel taxes are highly regressive — the burden falls hardest on poorer **LPJUSD** residents. Consider the **impact this new \$2,784 tax will have on families who struggle** financially.

We can best serve our kids by demanding responsible financial management and by insisting the district focus on fulfilling its core academic mission.
